‘Let me become all you planned for me when my seed was planted and selected by you to sprout in the vineyard of the world. Guide me, God.’”


ON SHENANIGANS

When any unexplainable events happened in the house, the Irish would pronounce the blessing invocation, *Shee nanna gasne*. It was both a polite greeting to the wee folk and a gentle invitation for them to



leave. For although the pranks of the wee folk were revered reminders to humans that they were not in total control of their lives, no one wanted the invisible visitors to be permanent house guests.
